

Matlab Commands and Outputs

A command that has two numbers separated by a colon will result in all the numbers between in increments of 1.	A command that has 3 numbers separated by colons will go from the 1st to last number in increments of the 2nd number	If there is a semicolon on any of the commands, nothing will result
t=2:7 will result in t= 2 3 4 5 6 7	t=9:-1:3 will result in t= 9 8 7 6 5 4 3	t=5; shows nothing
